Dear Mr. McLeod,

Re: University of Ottawa File No. AS-169, IPC Appeal No. PA08-342

This is a supplementary decision in furtherance to our letter of October 23, 2008 in response to your request for access to information under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (the "Act") which we received on September 24, 2008. Your request was for the following information:

- "1. Please provide a copy of all records pertaining to a presentation by the Canadian Friends of Burma and Ka Hsaw Wa of Earth Rights International titled : 'BURMA Blood Profits : Was Ottawa U's new Desmarais building paid for with cash tainted by the blood of innocent Burmese citizens? held Dec 5, 2007 in the Desmarais building. This should include but not be limited to, administration or protection services decisions, communications (Including inter-/intra-administration emails) and recent history covering the time period of November 1, 2007 to the present.
2. Please also provide a copy of any written rationale or university policy pertaining to any decisions taken regarding this event being held."

In response to mediation, we reviewed the responsive records wherein access was denied. As a result of this review, we are prepared to disclose record #20 in its entirety, to grant you further partial access to records # 17, #18 and #19, and to grant partial access to records #21 and #22. Please find enclosed these responsive records as well as a revised index.

We also wish to confirm that the searches conducted by the University of Ottawa in this matter did not reveal any transcripts, notes, memos, audio tapes or video tapes or any other type of surveillance records.

Main Speaker: Ka Hsaw Wa Co-Founder Earth Rights International and investigator into human rights abuses during the construction of the Total/UNOCAL Yadana natural gas pipeline. He will speak on the devastating impact to Burma from Total's partnership with Burma's violent dictatorship. Ka Hsaw Wa's investigation was the basis for the landmark lawsuit by villagers from Burma against UNOCAL for forced labour and human rights violations.

Also speaking will be Kevin McLeod and Tin Maung Htoo from the Canadian Friends of Burma.

Funding for the University of Ottawa's new 12 storey Desmarais building came in part from a \$15 million donation from billionaire Paul G. Desmarias, whom the building was named after. Mr. Desmarias, patriarch of the family that controls Power Corp. served on the board of the French Oil conglomerate Total from from January 1999 till May 2002 when he gave his seat to his son Paul Desmarais Jr. Power Corp. continues to own a significant share of Total. Total is infamous for its involvement in a pipeline in Burma in which it partnered with the Burmese military and UNOCAL. Construction of the pipeline caused severe environmental destruction, the forced relocation of thousands and benefited from child and forced labor provided by the very same villagers who were forced at gun point to leave their homes.

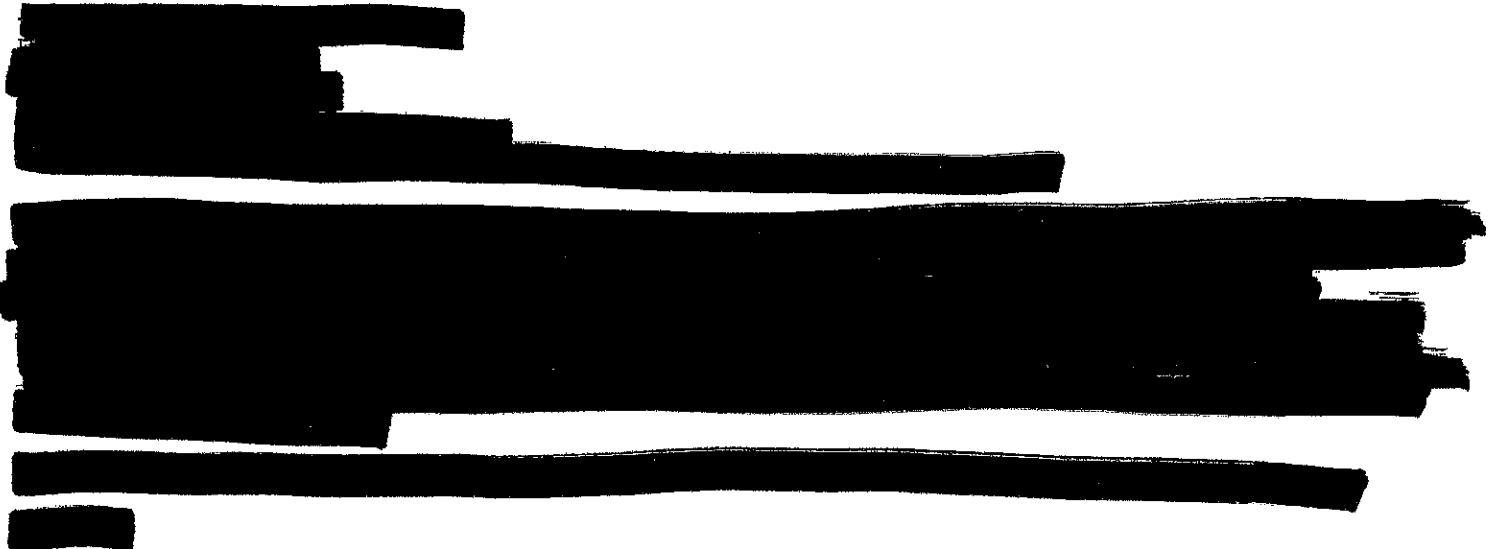

Back in July, I wrote a column about the decisions universities, museums and galleries make to accept (or reject) money from people or companies who have done business, even indirectly, with dictatorships. It was a hard column to write, because there are so many mitigating factors: how far back do you go, how direct does the involvement have to be, etc. It would have been easy, in a way, to get up on my high horse and condemn the institutions for taking blood money. And that's certainly a valid argument.

This Wednesday, Dec. 5, at 7 pm, some activists will argue that the **University of Ottawa** shouldn't have taken money from Paul G. Desmarais. They'll argue that in room 1140 of the Desmarais building itself (now that's democracy for you). Mr. Desmarais served on the board of the company now known as Total, which is involved in a gas pipeline in Burma. Here's what the Burma Campaign has to say.

My instinct is this: no matter how diligent investors are, it's impossible to enter into an ethical partnership with the current government of Burma. That is, after all, why Canada has placed a moratorium on all new investment there. Human Rights Watch does a good job of explaining how oil and gas projects help to prop up the junta.

The event on Wednesday will include remarks from Ka Hsaw Wa, an investigator for Earth Rights International and Kevin MacLeod and Tin Maung Htoo of Canadian Friends of Burma.

Hello Louis,

I attended the event which took place from 7 to 8:30 pm. Mr. Desmarais's name was mentioned a few times in the introductory speech by the organizer. What he said was mainly his account of chronology of events, such as Mr. Desmarais joined the board of TOTAL in Jan 1999 and held 4% of the share etc. No serious accusation was found. He did urge Mr. D clarified the involvement of his company in the pipeline construction and call for "canadian values" such as integrity and cooperate social responsibility. The speaker talked about human rights violations in Burma generally and how his organization held international corporations UNOCAL accountable through legal actions in the States.
