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Nov. 29th: I created a Facebook event "Faculty Council decides the future of the Activism Course" set for December 6th and invited various "Facebook friends" to the event. I have not invited Nathalie Page to the event. (It is the only person there who was not my "Facebook friend" when I created the event.) Nathalie Page was one of five people who confirmed their attendance on Facebook, but I do not remember seeing anyone looking like her Facebook picture at the actual meeting. I do remember seeing Maureen Robinson at the meeting.

Feb. 24th: I started the GoogleGroup (Reinstate the Activism Course) and invited people with previous interest (including those attending the December 6th "Faculty Council" event on Facebook). On February 27th, Nathalie Page asked to be added to the GoogleGroup with the address "[n.page8@gmail.com](mailto:n.page8@gmail.com)".

March 12th: GSAÉD Elections Debates at the University Centre agora. Severin Stojanovic is a candidate for the position of graduate student senator in the science section. Nearly everyone in the (small) attendance at these debates I recognized as candidates or friends of candidates. Just before Severin Stojanovic's debate (scheduled around 6pm), I noticed that Maureen Robinson arrived in the agora with a friend and using her laptop. I also noticed she left after Severin Stojanovic's debate. There was one more debate after she left, on the question of the student media referendum.

March 25th: A meeting was held at the University for the Reinstate the Activism Course. Another was held on May 21st. Nathalie Page was not in attendance at any of these meetings, nor at the Faculty Council meeting on May 23rd. Maureen Robinson was present at the May 23rd Faculty Council.

June 11th: Nathalie Page posts a message on the Facebook event "Resisting the University" (a conference at UBC where Denis Rancourt was a guest speaker). She asks: "Where can we find recordings from this conference?"

June 16th: I send a e-mail about a demonstration (picket line) planned for President Gilles Patry's goodbye party on June 18th. I send the e-mail to my contacts at the university, including the Reinstate the Activism Course GoogleGroup.

Nathalie Page replies to this e-mail thread:

"I agree with Michael. Also, is there a possibility of arrest? I think if there is a big enough group perhaps there is a smaller chance of confrontation (safety in numbers). How many people do you think will show up? I'd say if there is more than 10 I'd feel safe enough to go :-)

Do we need a ticket to get in to the party?
